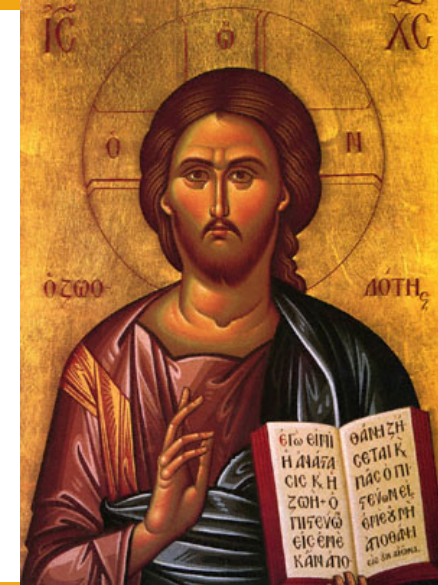

HOLY SCRIPTURE READING

EPISTLE – ROMANS 10: 1 - 10

GOSPEL – ST. MATTHEW 8: 28 - 34: 9:1

Brethren, indeed the good pleasure of my heart and entreaty to God on behalf of Israel is for their salvation. For I bear witness to them that they have a zeal for God, but not according to full knowledge. For they being ignorant of the righteousness of God, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, submitted not to the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law in regard to righteousness for everyone who believeth. For Moses writeth of the righteousness which is of the law, that “the man who doeth those things shall live in them.” But the righteousness which is of faith speaketh thus, “Say not in thy heart, ‘Who shall ascend into the heavens?’” (that is, to bring down Christ) or, “‘Who shall descend into the abyss?’” (that is, to bring up Christ from the dead). But what saith it? “The word is near to thee, in thy mouth and in thy heart” (that is, the word of faith which we proclaim): That if thou confess with thy mouth Jesus as Lord and believe in thy heart that God raised Him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart one believeth unto righteousness, and with the mouth one confesseth unto salvation.

At that time, when Jesus came to the other side, to the country of the Gergesenes, two demoniacs met him, coming out of the tombs, so fierce that no one would pass that way. And behold, they cried out, "What have you to do with us, O Son of God? Have you come here to torment us before the time?" Now a herd of many swine was feeding at some distance from them. And the demons begged him, "If you cast us out, send us away into the herd of swine." And he said to them, "Go." So they came out and went into the swine; and behold, the whole herd rushed down the steep bank into the sea, and perished in the waters. The herdsmen fled, and going into the city they told everything, and what had happened to the demoniacs. And behold, all the city came out to meet Jesus; and when they saw him, they begged him to leave their neighborhood. And getting into a boat he crossed over and came to his own city.
