

THE FALLING ASLEEP OF ST. JOHN THE THEOLOGIAN

HOLY SCRIPTURE READING

EPISTLE – I JOHN 4: 12 - 19

GOSPEL – JOHN 19: 25-27; 21: 24-25

No one hath beheld God at any time. If we be loving one another, God abideth in us, and His love is made perfect in us. In this we know that we abide in Him, and He in us, because He hath given us of His Spirit. And we have beheld and bear witness that the Father hath sent forth the Son as Savior of the world. Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God abideth in him, and he in God. And we have come to know and have believed the love which God hath in us. God is love; and the one abiding in love, abideth in God, and God in him. In this hath love been made perfect with us, in order that we may have boldness in the day of judgment, that even as He is, we are also in this world. There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear, because fear hath punishment; and the one who feareth hath not been made perfect in love. We love Him, because He first loved us.

At that time, standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home. This is the disciple who is bearing witness to these things, and who has written these things; and we know that his testimony is true. But there are also many other things which Jesus did; were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written.

Καὶ ἀπ’ ἐκεῖνης τῆς ὥρας ἔλαβεν ὁ μαθητὴς αὐτὴν εἰς τὰ ἴδια. Οὕτως ἐστὶν ὁ μαθητὴς ὁ μαρτυρῶν περὶ τούτων, καὶ γράψας ταῦτα· καὶ οἶδαμεν ὅτι ἀληθὴς ἐστὶν ἡ μαρτυρία αὐτοῦ. Ἔστιν δὲ καὶ ἄλλα πολλὰ ὅσα ἐποίησεν ὁ Ἰησοῦς, ἅτινα ἐὰν γράφηται καθ’ ἓν, οὐδὲ αὐτὸν οἶμαι τὸν κόσμον χωρῆσαι τὰ γραφόμενα βιβλία. Ἀμήν.
