HOLY SCRIPTURE READING

EPISTLE – II CORINTHIANS II: 31-33;
12: 1-9

GOSPEL – LUKE 6: 31-36

The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who is blessed to the ages, knoweth that I lie not. In Damascus the ethnarch of Aretas the king was guarding the city of the Damascenes, wishing to take me; and through a window in a braided rope-basket was I let down through the wall, and escaped his hands.

Indeed it is not expedient for me to boast; for I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord. I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago—whether in the body I know not, or out of the body I know not, God knoweth—such a one was carried off as far as the third heaven. And I know such a man—whether in the body or out of the body I know not, God knoweth—that he was caught up into Paradise and heard unspeakable words, which it is not allowed for a man to speak. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on behalf of myself I will not boast, except in my weaknesses. For if I should wish to boast, I shall not be foolish; for I will speak the truth. But I forbear, lest anyone should reckon to me above what he seeth me to be or what he heareth in any degree of me. And lest I should be lifted up by the surpassingness of the revelations, there was given to me a thorn for the flesh, a messenger of Satan, that he may keep on buffeting me, lest I should be lifted up. Concerning this I besought the Lord thrice, that it might stand off from me. And He hath said to me, “My grace is sufficient for thee; for My power is being made perfect in weakness.” Most gladly therefore will I rather boast in my weaknesses, that the power of the Christ might dwell upon me.

The Lord said, "And as you wish that men would do to you, do so to them. If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the selfish. Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful."

Πλὴν ἀγαπᾶτε τοὺς ἐχθροὺς ὑμῶν καὶ ἀγαθοποιεῖτε καὶ δανεῖζετε μὴδὲν ἀπελπίζοντες· καὶ ἔσται ὁ μισθὸς ὑμῶν πολὺς, καὶ ἔσεσθε υἱοὶ ὑψίστου, ὅτι αὐτὸς χρηστός ἐστὶν ἐπὶ τοὺς ἀχαρίστους καὶ πονηροὺς.
