# St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews 12:1-10

#### Prokeimenon. Mode Plagal 1 Psalm 11.7,1

You, O Lord, shall keep us and preserve us. Verse: Save me, O Lord, for the godly man has failed.

The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews 12:1-10

RETHREN, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. And have you forgotten the exhortation which addresses you as sons? "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor lose courage when you are punished by him. For the Lord disciplines him whom he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives." It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline? If you are left without discipline, in which all have participated, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. Besides this, we have had earthly fathers to discipline us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father.

We have reached the third Sunday of Great and Holy Lent - the Veneration of the Life-Giving Cross, Our Metropolis of Denver, on a semiannual basis, will offer a collection solely for the benefit of our own students. The financial contributions that you offer enable our students to exit the school with much lower debt and student loans.

We are blessed at our Theological School that the number of our own students from the Metropolis of Denver has increased. As of January 1, 2025, three graduates have been ordained in Denver and in Dallas, who have been and will be installed as priests to serve our parishes. There are three more potential candidates for priesthood that, God-willing, will occur by the end of the year. This is major, especially for our Metropolis to retain our students.

As of now, there is a large majority of students from our Metropolis, with six in Holy Cross (graduate school) and four in Hellenic College (undergraduate school) that are on the priesthood track of studies. There is potential for additional students that will begin in the fall of 2025.

Like many institutions of higher education, and a school the size of HCHC, costs continue to rise, needs are increasing, and the debt for our students will increase. Your support goes a long way to defray some of their debt.

I am asking you TODAY to offer your support to our students. And, of course, you are asked to always keep our students, along with the entire school, in praver.



They can range from anxiety or panic disorders, eating disorders, checking internet or social media to the point of shutting out your family, or to drug or alcohol addiction.




### Salutations to the Most Holy Theotokos Friday, March 14, 6pm

The role of the Panagia in the life of each human being is great. She mediates on our behalf to God for the salvation of our souls. For this reason our Church has chosen to integrate the Service of the Salutations with the Great Lent of Pascha.

The Akathist Hymn, which has been established since 626A.D., to show our deep gratitude to the Panagia, is divided into four sta-

sis' of the six letters of the Greek alphabet, the so-called Service of the Salutations, which is chanted every Friday evening of Great Lent, except on the fifth Friday the entire Akathist Hymn is chanted. The poet of the Salutations is considered to be Saint Romanos the Melodist, while the Canon of Praise of the Salutations which is chanted before each stasis was written by Saint Joseph the Hymnographer.



SUNDAY

### "Orthodoxy is what Christ taught, the apostles preached, and the Fathers kept."

— St. Athanasius the Great

The Triumph of Orthodoxy commemorates the restoration of icons as essential to Orthodox Christian biblical worship. They proclaim Christ as God incarnate in whom and by whom all

things were made, who is Himself the Icon of the invisible God (Colossians 1:15f.). He is the Icon in whom Man was made as male and female (Genesis 1:26-27). Because our "primary substance" is our having been made "in the Icon" that is Christ [Origen of Alexandria], our primary substance is "personal communion" that lives and has its being in the Holy Trinity.

The Triumph of Orthodoxy, then, proclaims the restoration of personal communion with God in the triumph of the Icon, Jesus Christ, over the devil and death. Eden has been opened again and we may enter to become gardeners of immortal plants, communicants of the divine nature (2 Peter 1:4).

But Eden is the "icon" of our heart, as St. Kallistos Angelikoudes reminds us. The Triumph of Orthodoxy therefore proclaims the destination of our Lenten journey: "Christ in you, the Hope of Glory." In the Light of Christ who illumines all, we take up the cross of the Fast to follow Christ from the Jordan into the wilderness of our own soul, and into the tomb of Lazarus, our own heart. Like Lazarus, we are called by Christ to "come forth" and to follow Him into His New Tomb and into the Garden of His Resurrection, the Pasture of eternal life in the Personal Communion of the Holy Trinity.


