## The Gospel According to John 19:6-11, 13-20, 25-28, 30

t that time, when the chief priests and the officers saw him, they cried out, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him, for I find no crime in him." The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and by that law he ought to die, because he has made himself the Son of God."

When Pilate heard these words, he was the more afraid; he entered the praetorium again and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave no answer. Pilate therefore said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release you, and power to crucify you?" Jesus answered him, "You would have no power over me unless it had been given you from above; therefore he who delivered me to you has the greater sin." When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgment seat at a place called the Pavement, and in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover; it was about the sixth hour. He said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" They cried out, "Away with him, away with him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." Then he handed him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus, and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called the place of a skull, which is called in Hebrew Golgotha. There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them. Pilate also wrote a title and put it on the cross; it read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." Many of the Jews read this title, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, in Latin, and in Greek.

But standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son!" Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home. Then when Jesus had received the vinegar, he said, "It is finished"; and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

On September 1, our Holy Christian Orthodox Church celebrates the beginning of the New Ecclesiastical Year. The Church also calls us during this month to approach with reverence the Holy Cross which we commemorate on September 14<sup>th</sup>. This is a great day as witnessed to by the faithful who venerate the Holy Cross to receive its divine grace.

It is for this reason that I call upon you to support and participate in the education of our young people that have been called to serve Christ and His Church.

On behalf of His Eminence Metropolitan Constantine, who is in Boston today, I greet you on this September 11, 2025, Twenty-Four years following the tragic events of that day in New York City, Washington, DC, and the hills of Pennsylvania. May the Memory of the nearly 3000 innocents who lost their lives that day be eternal. In light of this event and other recent tragic shootings, at Annunciation Roman Catholic School and Church in Minneapolis, MN, and yesterday at Evergreen High School, west of Denver, CO, and the murder of Charlie Kirk at Utah Valley University in Orem, UT, may our Lord bless, be with and protect innocent people and most especially our children from these senseless acts of violence and evil. In light of the divisions and wars in Ukraine, Gaza, the Middle East, and other problem places in the world, and the political unrest and divisions in our own country, please see the following remarks from Elder Zacharias of Essex:

"We do not know everything about the conflicts of this world, nor is it necessary to know. We just pray with a compassionate heart for the peace of the world and for all. We do not take sides, because each side will be responsible for crimes, and we do not want to share in these crimes and be condemned. If we pray for those who are more wrong than right, well, we perform the commandment to love even enemies. And if we pray for those who are more right than wrong, we do well. Therefore, we cannot go wrong if we pray that God saves all and grants peace to the world. Especially for us, priests and monks, it is very important not to be political at all, because we offer our sacrifice to God, the Holy Liturgy, for the whole world; and if we are for some and against others, our sacrifice is annulled. I think that when there is a war, the best is not to be judgmental, but to have compassion and pray that the Lord may spare all from suffering. 




